The Advance Global Australians Report 2025 delves into the experiences of Australians living abroad, focusing on their connections with the Australian community and their perceptions upon returning.


The report's findings are based on 15 minute survey conducted by research company CoreData and interviews with 500 Australians across the globe from September-October 2024 with a focus on community engagement and its broader implications for Australians and the nation.



The Case For Action

Findings from the Advance Global Australians Report 2025:

1. Desire to Return Home:

- 95% of Australians abroad want to return, but only 15% have concrete plans due to systemic barriers such as high living costs, lack of job opportunities, and reintegration challenges.
- Family connections, healthcare access, and social life are top motivators for returning.

2. Challenges Abroad:

 Navigating government systems, maintaining ties with Australia, and accessing trusted services remain significant obstacles for expatriates.

3. Opportunities for Australia:

- Australians abroad represent a motivated, underutilized resource with global expertise that can drive innovation, sustainability, and entrepreneurship.
- Diaspora members seek stronger connections and recognition from home, including support for self-promotion and their global achievements.

4. Strategic Needs:

- Clearer pathways for returnees to reintegrate into Australian society.
- Stronger advocacy and policies to address housing, job market challenges, and social support systems.

Findings from the IMD World Competitiveness Yearbook 2024:

1. Global Competitiveness:

- Australia ranks lower than leading nations in key areas like government efficiency, innovation, and infrastructure.
- Competitiveness requires fostering innovation, attracting talent, and addressing sustainability challenges.

2. Economic and Social Opportunities:

- Smaller economies with a focus on sustainability, equality, and global collaboration outperform larger ones.
- Investing in human capital, green innovation, and global connectivity is essential to remain competitive.

3. Talent Retention:

- High living costs and lack of professional opportunities make it challenging to attract or retain skilled talent.
- Supporting expatriates' contributions can help Australia address skill shortages and improve its global standing.


